



Academic Success


All Illinois students in grades 3-8 take the IAR assessment each year. High school students take the SAT in English Language Arts and Math.







Success by Student Group



School Highlights

Academic Courses

Havlicek School has implemented a district-wide ELA and Math Curricula aligned to the CCSS to preparing our student for college and career readiness. The school offers a full-day kindergarten, a two-way dual language program in PreK-2nd grade and inclusion classes at each grade level. A MTSS framework is used to meet the needs of the whole child.

Physical Education, Heath and Wellness

Havlicek School offers P.E. classes and /or movement activities daily. The fresh fruit and vegetable program is provided to the students to encourage healthy snacks. A social-emotional curriculum is taught through the Second Step program within the weekly schedule.


Havlicek School offers a variety of of clubs and activities to students before and after school.

School Awards

Havlicek School recognizes students on a monthly, quarterly, semester and yearly for both academic, social-emotional learning and extra curricular clubs / activities. Faulty and staff are recognized throughout the year though our PBIS program and year by the district.

School-Level Finance

The Every Student Succeeds Act requires LEAs to report school-level expenditure data, beginning with School Year 18-19 data. LEAs are required to report actual personnel and non-personnel expenditures of both site-specific and district centralized expenditures. Career Development Courses and Programs

Havlicek School has an agreement with Concordia University Chicago; university students from the "Teaching in Diverse Classrooms" program work weekly with students in each classroom providing needed interventions to promote more successful learning experiences.

Havlicek School offers variety of athletic activities to students before and after school.

School Personnel Resources

Regular Pupil Personnel Services Meetings (PPS) are held to discuss the progress of students at risk. Teachers consult with Instructional Specialists and this PPS Team to help determine the most effective interventions based upon students' academic data and progress. Regular data examinations help the team target each student's specific needs.

Facilities

Havlicek School is impeccably maintained. We have a designated art room, music room, gymnasium, auditorium with stage, a school commons area and new playground equipment including a butterfly garden.

Educator Measures

This school has had **2 principal(s)** over the past 6 years. In the last three years, an average of **87% of teachers** return to this school each year.
