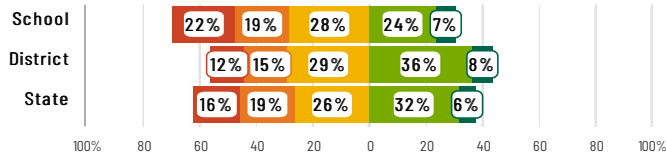

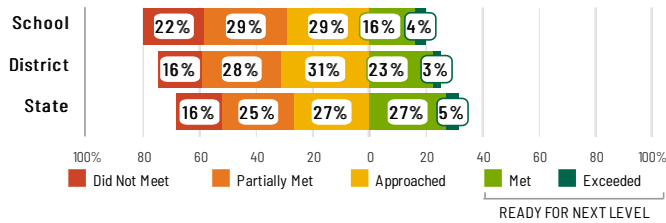
Academic Success

English Language Arts



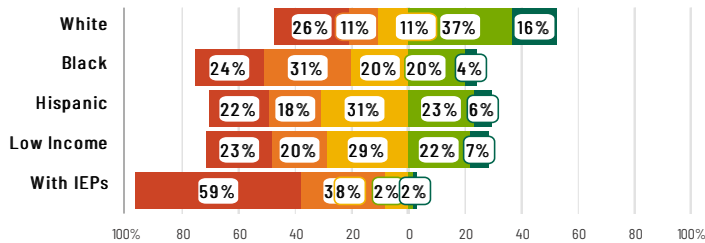

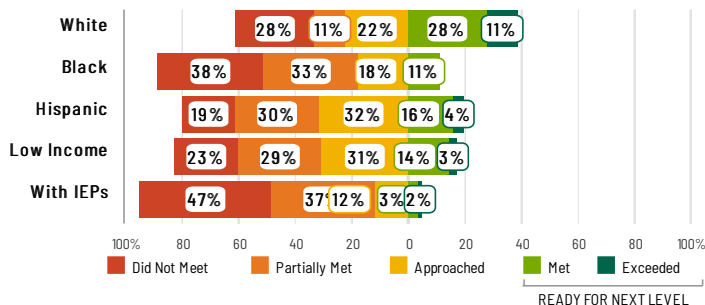
Success by Student Group

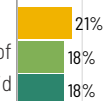
Attendance Rate

Rate at which students are present at school, not including excused or unexcused absences



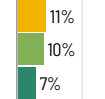
Chronic Absenteeism

School Highlights

Academic Courses

We, at Prairie Oak Elementary School, believe that all students can be successful learners. We provide differentiated academic supports for all learners. We offer a variety of programs including full day kindergarten, dual language, honors, bilingual education, inclusion, and developmental learning for special education students.

Physical Education, Health and Wellness

Our physical education program promotes physical fitness and wellness activities. The curriculum helps prepare our students to lead healthy and active lifestyles.

Other Programs and Activities

Prairie Oak has aligned CHARACTER COUNTS! and PBIS (Positive Behaviors Interventions and Supports) and has implemented the Second Step Curriculum. We also offer before and after-school activities such as Accelerated Reader/Homework programs and Math support for students. Our fifth graders annually engage in a program called, "Dancing Classrooms."

School Awards

We strive to acknowledge students and their accomplishments. Some of the awards offered at Prairie Oak are Personal Development, Study Habits, Attendance, Gold/Silver Honor Roll, Reading Growth, Math Growth, and Accelerated Reading.

Career Development Courses and Programs

College and career readiness is one of the focus areas here at Prairie Oak. Our curriculum incorporates preparing our students for college and career through all of the content areas.

Athletics

We encourage our students to participate in our athletic offerings such as the intermediate sports club. We also participate in Special Olympics this school year with our Intermediate Developmental Learning program. Other club offerings are yoga and Latin Dance.

School Personnel Resources

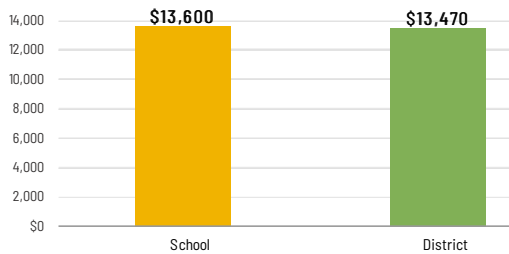
Our personnel resources include bilingual and special educational supports. Our qualified staff collaborate to provide effective educational programming for students. We continue to offer professional development and resources in the areas of best practice strategies with instruction, social emotional learning, and assessment methods.

Facilities

Prairie Oak has a beautifully renovated media center and well-equipped gymnasium. Our Commons area hosts different events such as choir groups, guest authors, and play performances.

School-Level Finance
